Old Business

- 1. Rule Update and Side-by-Side Rule Language Review: Linda Prail
 - a. A draft copy of the rule revisions and a side-by-side copy of the rule revision changes had been sent out for Council review.
 - b. Linda informed the Council that that the Request For Comments has been signed by MDH and that we are preparing to get the Governor's approval for publication. The date of publication will be announced to the Council before the publication date.
 - c. Credential/title
 - i. Linda asked the Council why both R.E.H.S. and R.S. were used as credentials and are both credentials/titles needed?
 - There was much discussion by the Council. The Council unanimously decided that MDH would put together a survey to send out to all affected parties. The results of the survey would be sent all Council members for further discussion.
 (MDH sent the survey out to 440 recipients on 10/19/2020 and it closed 11/02/2020.)
 - d. Full-time employment 35 hours
 - i. Linda and Nick advised the Council to provide a definition for the phrase "full- time employment" in the proposed rule language. Nick stated that to apply the phrase, a definition would be needed. He further stated that a definition could be created that allows flexibility.
 - 1. There was much discussion by the Council. The Council decided to have further discussion regarding the language Neile provided from the Minnesota Engineer credential described in part 1800.2500 supb. 4D. The language is as follows: "One year of experience consists of full- or part- time employment that extends over a period of no less than 12 months and includes no fewer than 2,000 hours of performance of engineering work described in part 1800.2805." Further discussion on this item will be tabled until the next meeting.
