Glencoe, MN Community Testing Demographics

These demographics and results are for testing completed on August 20, 2020, at Glencoe City Center, Glencoe, MN. Testing was offered by the State of Minnesota in partnership with the City of Glencoe and McLeod County Public Health.

- Testing was open to everyone. Residents of neighboring communities were eligible to be tested. People who lived further away were encouraged to find a local clinic before registering.
- People with and without symptoms were tested.
- Testing was free, no insurance needed.
- Pre-registration was encouraged and could be done online and by phone.
- Testing was administered by professional medical staff.

Positivity rate: 6.43%

- 949 people were tested.
- 61 people were confirmed positive (cases).

Symptoms


59% of those who tested positive did not have symptoms at the time of testing. This speaks to the importance of staying home and isolating if you believe you were exposed and wearing a mask and washing your hands to reduce potential spread.


