Age span targeted by tool	Birth through 7 years	Birth through 5 ½ years (66 months)
Purpose	"To determine if a child has an undiagnosed developmental disability that requires further evaluation"	A parent questionnaire designed to assist professionals with the screening and identification of young children with developmental delays.
Developmental areas	Global/cognitive, expressive language and articulation, receptive language, fine motor, gross motor, behavior, social-emotional, self-help, school and other Note: separate social-emotional screening is recommended.	Communication, Gross Motor, Fine Motor, Problem Solving, Personal-Social Note: separate social-emotional screening is recommended.
