

RUG-IV: Who to Call for Case Mix Information?

What is Case Mix?

Minnesota Case Mix is a system that classifies residents into distinct groups, called Resource Utilization Groups (RUGs), based on the resident's condition and the care the resident received at the time of the assessment. A value is assigned to each group, which is then used to calculate the daily rate of payment.

Who should residents, or the resident's representatives, talk to when they have questions about the classification that has been assigned?

- The nursing facility staff are familiar with the resident and are the first source of
 information about the classification assigned to the resident. That might be the social
 worker, a nurse who works with the collection of the data (often referred to as the MDS
 Nurse), or the administrator.
- The staff at the Minnesota Department of Health Case Mix Review Program are good sources of information about the case mix system.

- Staff in the Office of the Ombudsman for Long-Term Care are familiar with the Minimum
 Data Set (MDS) assessment and the case mix system and can often help in understanding
 the assigned case mix classification or in requesting a reconsideration.
