

Appendix D: Healthcare Provider-Reported Negative Effects from Medical Cannabis

Note: Word choice and spellings have been retained as written by respondent to avoid inadvertent mischaracterization of intent. Brackets have been used to explain words redacted to prevent individual identification or for other reasons. Negative effects are broken down into type of negative effect, and by negative effect score rating.

Physical Negative Effects

Mental Negative Effects

- Pt describes some dependence
- Can affect concentration and motivation at times. Can incr appetite but no significant weight gain. [HIGH THC PRODUCT] can make him tired, but he uses it for sleep.
- Irritability in withdrawal
- Notices he is less intellectually nimble when playing chess. Doesn't wake up tired.
 Doesnt notice any cognitive SEs unless playing chess, and can still play
- Very mild trouble focusing/maintaining attention
- patient reports feeling "zoned out" at night
- she initially had trouble with feeling "too high" but says that she has figured out the appropriate dosage for herself now.
