<p>Schizophrenia is a chronic and severe mental disorder that affects how a person thinks, feels, and behaves. People with schizophrenia can may seem like they have lost touch with reality. Schizophrenia is not as common as other mental disorders, however, the symptoms are very disabling.</p> <p>Symptoms are psychotic behaviors not seen in healthy people, as "losing touch" with some aspects of reality: Hallucinations, delusions, thought disorders (unusual or dysfunctional ways of thinking), movement disorders (agitated body movements). Other symptoms are disruption to normal emotions and behaviors: Reduced expression of emotions via facial expressions, reduced feelings of pleasure in everyday life, difficulty beginning and sustaining activities, poor "executive functioning" the ability to understand information and use it to make decisions, trouble focusing or paying attention, problems with "working memory" the ability to use information immediately after learning it. (National Institute of Mental Health).</p>

Schizophrenia has been part of my brother's life since he was diagnosed 10 years ago at the age of 19 years. If you've ever had the chance to know someone before and after their schizophrenia diagnosis it is undoubtedly heartbreaking. The brother I had before his diagnosis was happy, social, had a bright outlook for his future and what he wanted to get out of his life's journey. Now my brother has difficulty grasping the reality of making these life aspirations happen for himself. Schizophrenia impairs my brother's social life, making meaningful relationships even within his immediate family, as well as impairing his ability to be an active member of society. The treatment he receives from his psychiatrist is unethical! The antipsychotic medication she proscribes sedate him, therefore keeping him home, depressed and unable to be social and an active member of society. Again due to his disorder he does not have the skill of "executive functioning" to inform his psychiatrist that this is a form of maltreatment.

The antipsychotic medications my brother takes decrease his hallucinations, delusions, and some dysfunctional ways of thinking, therefore easing what is his reality. However as these antipsychotics may ease his daily thoughts they also cause side effects, many in which cause organ failure and eventually death. And so once he gets mentally healthier and is able to understand the warning signs/side effects of his medication he starts self regulating his dosages because he doesn't want his organs to fail him, he wants to live, as he should we all do. And once he starts self dosing he regresses and becomes mentally unstable. Occasionally he attends group meetings with others suffering from mental disorders, but this only helps to a certain degree.

has talked about taking social skill building classes somewhere within his community to help him understand the mental steps and social skills to getting a job and then holding that job. However I'm not sure when this goal will be reached since his disorder reduces the feeling of taking pleasure in having a job.
